

MARSHFIELD EAGLES AERIE #624
High School Senior Scholarship Application

Eligibility Requirements

1. High school seniors interested in higher education and who have at least one parent or grandparent who is a member or who is the survivor of a member in good standing of Eagle Aerie #624 or Auxiliary may apply.
2. Areas of coverage eligibility is limited to those areas in Central Wisconsin covered by Eagles Aerie #624.
3. Student must have a grade point average of at least 2.75. A high school transcript of grades must accompany the application.
4. **Students must show, by signed recommendations (at least 2 letters of reference), that he/she has shown service / volunteer work during high school. Business/High School letterhead desired. When listing community service and volunteer work, identify the year and the number of hours involved. Example: Red Cross worker; 2015, 30 hours.**
5. Student must plan to attend one of the following accredited institutions during the fall term:
 - a. College or university
 - b. Technical school
 - c. Any other accredited educational program approved by the scholarship committee.
6. Submit a completed application form and typed essay. Essay must detail future plans.

Awards

1. The Rupert M. Christman Scholarship for \$750.
The Stanley E. Fait Scholarship for \$500.
The Harry E. Miller Scholarship for \$500.
2. Students winning scholarships will receive the scholarship money after successfully completing the first semester of classes. An Official transcript is to be presented to the treasurer.
3. You may earn one scholarship as a high school senior.
You may earn one scholarship as a college student.
A maximum of two scholarships may be earned from the Aerie #624.
4. If you are not a recipient of one of the scholarships this year as a senior in high school, you have the opportunity to apply again during your years in college. No previous winner of a scholarship may win again, unless no new applicant who is deserving is found.
5. Describe your current and past involvement in the community. Explain how you think you will become involved in the future within your community. One page. This may be separate or part of your essay.

Deadline

All application forms, grade transcripts, character recommendations (service record) and essay must be submitted by March 1st. Essay must detail future plans. Winners will be notified by mail and will be recognized at awards ceremonies and/or the newspaper.
