Clark County Law Enforcement Association **Scholarship Program**

The Clark County Law Enforcement Association (CCLEA) scholarship program is intended to encourage and financially assist those students who are interested in pursuing a career in the Criminal Justice System. Our goal is to help develop qualified students into exceptional professionals.

CCLEA will award up to two \$250.00 scholarships each year. The recipient will be selected by the CCLEA administration. All decisions made by the Association are final. CCLEA is an equal opportunity organization and encourages everyone to apply.

CCLEA scholarship applicant requirements:

- ❖ The applicant must currently be a Clark County resident or graduated from high school as a Clark County resident.
- ❖ The applicant must be accepted as a full-time student at a Wisconsin Technical College or a public or private University in Wisconsin.
- ❖ The applicant must be enrolled in a Criminal Justice System related program such as Law Enforcement, Probation/Parole, Social Work, Child Protective Services, etc.
- ❖ **Scholarships will be awarded upon completion of one college semester (with minimum GPA of 2.5) and submission of college transcript from that semester.**

To apply:

- ❖ Complete and submit a CCLEA Scholarship Application.
- ❖ Enclose two letters of recommendation from separate sources which may include teachers, neighbors, clergy, employers, civic organizations, law enforcement, etc. No relations/relatives.
- ❖ If a high school senior, submit letter of acceptance to a college.
- ❖ Enclose a transcript of high school and/or college grades.
- ❖ Scholarship applications must be postmarked no later than
